MANDATORY WATER CONSERVATION: The Water Conservation Ordinance prohibits watering landscapes between 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. year round. These regulations insure adequate water supplies for sanitation and fire protection. Do your part!

Below is your watering schedule:

- MONDAY: No watering allowed
- TUESDAY & FRIDAY: Non-residential sites (apartments, businesses, parks, common areas)
- WEDNESDAY & SATURDAY: Residential addresses ending in 0, 2, 4, 6, 8
- THURSDAY & SUNDAY: Residential addresses ending in 1, 3, 5, 7, 9

SAGINAW ELECTION RESULTS: The City of Saginaw's General and Special Elections were held on Saturday, May 9. The official results are below:

A Special Election was held on May 9th for the Reauthorization of the Local Sales and Use Tax in the City of Saginaw at the rate of one-eighth of one percent to continue providing revenue for Maintenance and Repair of Municipal Streets. It passed with 342 people voting for the reauthorization and 34 people voting against.

For Mayor, Gary Brinkley ran unopposed and received 306 votes. **In Place 2** of the City Council, Patrick Farr received 204 votes, James Patterson received 106 votes, and Cindy Bighorse received 50 votes.

Mayor Gary Brinkley and Patrick Farr were sworn in at the May 19th City Council meeting.

Fun Facts About the City of Saginaw

Did you know that during the month of April 2015 at the Saginaw Animal Services, twenty-eight (28) animals were adopted and thirty-one (31) animals were returned to their owners?

Did you know that the staff of the Saginaw Animal Services recently planted a vegetable garden in front of the Center? The garden included tomatoes, squash, basil, jalapenos and rosemary.

Did you know that the Saginaw Senior Center partnered with AARP to host free tax return assistance for seniors? 139 seniors were served saving them over \$27,000 in tax preparation fees.

Did you know that the Eagle Mountain 4H Club recently did a community service project for the Saginaw Senior Center? They installed birdfeeders on the porch and added new freshly planted plants by each entrance door.

Sign up for the Saginaw CodeRED Emergency Notification System

The City of Saginaw emergency management has instituted the CodeRED emergency notification system, an extremely high-speed telephone service for emergency notifications. This system allows us to telephone all or targeted areas of the city in case of an emergency that requires immediate action, such as severe weather notices or missing children notices. The system is capable of delivering up to 60,000 calls per hour with our recorded message to a live person or answering machine, making three attempts to connect to any number.

Emergency Examples: This system will only be used for emergency purposes. Examples of times when the CodeRED system could be utilized: Bomb threat; Chemical spill or gas leak; Drinking water contamination; Evacuation notice and route; Fires or floods; Missing person; Other emergency incidents where rapid and accurate notification is essential

Garage Sale Information

Garage sale permits must be obtained at Saginaw City Hall at least 48 hours prior to sale. The cost of the garage sale permit is \$5.00 which includes three signs per garage sale (1 yard sign and 2 directional signs). Additional signs are prohibited. No signs shall be placed on utility poles. The owner or occupant of residential property is allowed two (2) sales per calendar year. The garage sale permit can not exceed three consecutive days. The permit must be displayed on the premises during the sale.
