Utility Billing Reminder

The winter month's water consumption of November, December and January are used to calculate the sewer average for residential customers. To figure your sewer average, add the three amounts of water consumption and divide by 3. This will be the consumption used for your new sewer average for the upcoming year. This is an annual process. The new sewer average for the year will be used starting with your February 2017 bill. If you have a leak during one of the months used for your averaging, please repair the leak immediately and contact us no later than January 31, 2017 at either 817-230-0321 or 817-230-0338.

Sign up for the Saginaw CodeRED Emergency Notification System

The City of Saginaw emergency management has instituted the CodeRED emergency notification system, an extremely high-speed telephone service for emergency notifications. This system allows us to telephone all of the targeted areas of the city in case of an emergency that requires immediate action, such as severe weather notices or missing children notices. The system is capable of delivering up to 60,000 calls per hour with our recorded message to a live person or answering machine, making three attempts to connect to any number.

Emergency Examples: This system will only be used for emergency purposes. Examples of times when the CodeRED system could be utilized: Bomb threat; Chemical spill or gas leak; Drinking water contamination; Evacuation notice and route; Fires or floods; Missing person; Other emergency incidents where rapid and accurate notification is essential for life safety like threatening or approaching severe weather or Utility outages.



Saginaw Business Beautification Award

The Business Beautification Award is a new program designed by the Saginaw Beautification Committee to recognize Saginaw business owners whose properties reflect pride of ownership and commitment to the beautification of the city. The purpose of this program is to recognize a local business for taking positive steps to make Saginaw a beautiful and attractive city in which to live, to conduct business, and to call home. Now is your chance to recognize a Saginaw Business for enhancing their appearance and beautifying our great community.

To be nominated or considered for recognition, a Saginaw business must be in total compliance with all city codes and ordinances.

Awards are given in three (3) categories:

Overall Appearance: This category includes business facilities that exhibit a sustained quality and professional appearance. It may include superior landscaping, fresh paint, and/or new and professional signage, as well as parking lot, tree, and building structure maintenance and improvement.



Most Improved: This category includes those businesses that have made an obvious effort to improve the property appearance within the previous six months.

Superior Landscaping: This category is self-explanatory. The business must maintain greenery to qualify in this category.
